Lack of Funding Causes Community Legal Services Lay Offs

Budget cuts both federally and locally combined with a fall in IOLTA revenue has caused Community Legal Services (CLS) to be in dire need of funds to maintain services. The non-profit legal aid recently laid off 7 attorneys, since funding was not going to be available to keep them on staff. On average a legal aid attorney handles 300 cases per year. The loss of 7 attorneys means approximately 2100 people will not receive legal help or court representation for issues such as housing, domestic violence and child custody.
